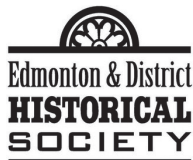
To recognize this value, the City of Edmonton developed the **Historic Resources Management Program**. Under this program, buildings and structures with historic significance are identified. Those that apply for designation as a Municipal Historic Resource are eligible for funding to protect and maintain their original character.

There are currently 154 designated Municipal Historic Resources and nearly 1000 historic resources on the Inventory eligible for designation in Edmonton. These can be found on the *“Register and Inventory of Historic Resources in Edmonton”*.
