

in the greater Edmonton region.

Prohibition

Prohibition was the result of generations of effort by temperance workers to close bars and taverns. They were seen as a source of unhappiness in an age before social welfare existed.

Temperance activists and their allies believed that alcohol, especially hard liquor, was an obstacle to economic success, to social cohesion, and to moral and religious purity.

By 1923, Alberta voters were done with being dry. A petition led to a plebiscite, where a majority voted in favour of allowing liquor sales through the government, which came into effect in 1924.

Today, Alberta has at least 47 licensed distillers, 133 breweries and at least 10 wineries and meaderies with most selling directly to the consumer or in collaboration with local restaurants.

Take this walking tour of downtown St. Albert that focuses on the history of the well-known Bruin Inn. In the mid-twentieth century, Alberta's strict liquor laws did not allow men and women to drink together, but St. Albert was an exception. The Bruin Inn attracted people from miles around and was a hot spot during the Second World War. In the 70's and 80's after rules were relaxed, the hotel became a great entertainment venue. It was THE place to be on a Saturday night. Hear of some stories of memorable gatherings at the Bruin Inn when it used to stand in Downtown St. Albert.







In 1915, Alberta embarked on a social experiment that would impact the lives of all Albertans: Prohibition. A century after the repeal of prohibition in 1923, the Provincial Archives of Alberta is pleased to present Dried Out: Prohibition in Alberta. The exhibit explores how temperance, one of the great progressive crusades of the early 20th century, took root in Alberta. The moral and political crusade to ban alcohol would have unintended consequences, both good and bad. It spurred the push for women's suffrage, lead to the creation of the Alberta Provincial Police, and prompted experiments in direct democracy. But it would also lead to people flouting the law at all levels of society, which would shape politics, policies, and communities for years to come. The exhibit is free and open to the public.



There are currently 177 designated Municipal Historic Resources and nearly 1000 historic resources on the Inventory eligible for designation in Edmonton. These can be found on the "Register and Inventory of Historic Resources in Edmonton" through the City's Open Data portal, at data edmonton ca.


